A BILL TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE FOR EXPECT-ANT MOTHERS WHO ARE IN POOR FINANCIAL CIRCUMSTANCES.

NOTE.

This Bill empowers the Lieutenant Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Minister of Health to provide for grants of not more than fifteen dollars to expectant mothers who are in need of assistance.

It also provides for the appointment of additional district nurses in areas where existing nursing facilities are inadequate.

Expenditures under this Bill are to be made out of moneys appropriated by the Legislature for the purpose.

An Act to Provide Assistance for Expectant Mothers Who Are in Poor Financial Circumstances.

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Maternal Welfare Act."

2. Upon the recommendation of the Minister of Health, the Lieutenant Governor in Council may by order make regulations,—

- (a) providing for the making of a grant of not more than fifteen dollars to any expectant mother who is in poor financial circumstances, whether in receipt of relief or not, for the purpose of providing such mother with necessities and the purpose of providing special foods or drugs necessary for the infant during the first year of its life or for any such purpose;
- (b) prescribing the conditions or circumstances under which such grants may be made;
- (c) as to the persons by whom and the manner in which any such grants shall be made.

3. With the approval of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, the Minister may appoint one or more district nurses for any area or areas in which the existing nursing facilities are inadequate and prescribe the terms of their engagement, their remuneration and their duties.

4. All expenditures made pursuant to this Act or any regulations made in pursuance thereof, shall be defrayed out of such sums as may be from time to time appropriated by the Legislature for that purpose.

5. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
