No. 95 of 1939.

An Act Providing for the Acknowledgement of Certain
Guarantees.

(Assented to , 1939.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of
the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta,
enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Guarantees Acknowledgement Act.*"

2. In this Act the word "guarantee" means any deed or other instrument in writing whereby any person other than a body corporate enters into any obligation to answer for any act or default or omission on the part of any other person whatsoever, but does not include any bill of exchange, cheque or promissory note, or any agreement of partnership, or any bond or recognizance, given to His Majesty or to any Court or to any judge thereof or made or given pursuant to any statute, or to any guarantee given on the sale of any interest in land or upon the sale of any interest in any goods or chattels.

3. No guarantee executed after the day upon which this Act comes into force shall have any force or effect unless the person entering into the obligation created thereby appears before a notary public and acknowledges his execution thereof and unless the notary public being satisfied by examination of that person that he is aware of the contents of the guarantee and understands the same, issues a certificate under his hand and seal of office which shall be in the following form:

4. The fee payable to a notary public for the issuance of a certificate under this Act and all incidental services shall not exceed the sum of one dollar.

5. This Act shall come into force on the first day of July, 1939.
