

Bill No. 11 of 1941

A BILL TO AMEND THE DISTRICT COURTS ACT

NOTE.

In 1933 an amendment was made to section 3 of *The District Courts Act* providing for a reduction in the number of such courts. In the section which was substituted the provision making the District Courts Courts of Record was, it is presumed inadvertently, omitted.

The purpose of this amendment is merely to reinsert in the Act the provision contained in the original section whereby District Courts were constituted Courts of Record. It is made retroactive in effect so as to apply from the date when the amendment omitting this provision came into force by Proclamation.

BILL

No. 11 of 1941

An Act to amend The District Courts Act.

(Assented to _____, 1941.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The District Courts Act Amendment Act, 1941.*"

2. *The District Courts Act*, being chapter 73 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1922, is hereby amended by striking out section 3 thereof, and by substituting therefor the following:

3. There shall be in and for the Province of Alberta, two courts of record to be styled respectively, The District Court of the District of Northern Alberta, and The District Court of the District of Southern Alberta."

3. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to, and upon so coming into force shall be deemed to have been in force at all times since the thirty-first day of July, 1935.
