An Act to amend The Optometry Act.

(Assented to _____, 1942.)

WHEREAS a petition has been presented, praying for the amendment to *The Optometry Act*, as hereinafter set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition;

Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Optometry Act Amendment Act, 1942.*"

2. *The Optometry Act*, being chapter 77 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1921, is hereby amended as to section 6 thereof by striking out subsection (1) thereof and substituting therefor the following:

"**6.**—(1) There shall be a council of management of the association consisting of such number and including such officers as the association shall from time to time by by-law enact. The members thereof shall be elected by the association for such term and in such manner as the by-law may provide, but in no case shall a member hold office without re-election for a longer term than until the second annual meeting following his election."

3. The said Act is further amended as to section 9 thereof by adding thereto as subsection (3) the following:

"(3.) (a) Every such applicant having submitted himself for examination pursuant to the first subsection hereof, upon the payment of such fee as may from time to time be fixed by the association therefor may be granted by the council in its discretion with the approval of the board an interim license enabling such applicant to practice optometry but only at the usual place of business and in the employ of a person duly registered under this Act and in good standing; and any such applicant shall be deemed to be registered under this Act within the meaning of section 14 hereof during such period as he holds a valid interim license:

"Provided that the council or the board may at any time revoke such interim license whereupon the same shall cease to be valid.

“(b) Any such interim license shall cease to be valid on the expiration of thirty days from the date upon which the result of such applicant’s examination is published unless renewed by the board, in which case the same shall cease to be valid on the expiration of thirty days from the date upon which the results of the next following examinations of the board are published, and shall not be further renewed.

“(c) No such applicant shall be granted more than one interim license.”

4. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
