A BILL TO AMEND THE CHIROPRACTIC ACT.

NOTE.

This Bill amends *The Chiropractic Act*.

The amendment permits residents of the Province who now hold a diploma from a school of chiropractic and who were absent from the Province attending a school of chiropractic at the time the Act was passed to obtain a license without examination on payment of the fee of \$50.

The fee for renewal of registration is increased from \$10 to \$15.

An Act to amend The Chiropractic Act.

(Assented to _____, 1942.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "*The Chiropractic Act Amendment Act, 1942.*"

2. *The Chiropractic Act*, being chapter 58 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1923, is hereby amended by inserting immediately following section 6, the following new section:

"**6a.**—(1) Any person who has been a resident of the Province for the continuous period of one year prior to the first day of March, A.D. 1942, and who,—

"(a) on the twenty-first day of April, 1923, was duly registered at a school of chiropractic; and

"(b) is the holder of a diploma from a school of chiropractic granted to him after the completion of a course or courses of resident study at such school of not less than twelve months within a period not exceeding three years; and

"(c) is of good moral character; and

"(d) is over the age of twenty-one years,—

may apply to the Minister to be registered under the provisions of this Act.

"(2) The application shall be in writing and shall be in such form as the Minister may prescribe. The Minister may require the applicant to furnish any information or evidence of the matters therein stated as he deems proper.

"(3) The applicant shall pay to the Minister as a fee the sum of fifty dollars at the time of making such application.

"(4) Upon being satisfied that the applicant has complied with the provisions of this section, the Minister may proceed to register the applicant as a person entitled to practise as a chiropractor under the provisions of this Act."

3. The Act is further amended as to section 11 by striking out the word "ten", where it occurs in the second line of subsection (2) thereof, and by substituting therefor the word "fifteen".

4. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
