The amendment proposed by this Bill alters the definition of "public place" to include a conveyance such as an automobile when it is in any public place.

An Act to amend The Government Liquor Control
Act of Alberta.

(Assented to _____, 1943.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of
the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta,
enacts as follows:

1. *The Government Liquor Control Act of Alberta*, being
chapter 24 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is
hereby amended as to section 2 by striking out paragraph
(u) thereof and by substituting therefor the following:

“(u) ‘Public place’ includes any place or building to
which the public has or is permitted to have access,
any place of public resort and any conveyance in
any public place;”

2. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which
it is assented to.
