A BILL TO AMEND THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY
ACT.

NOTE.

This Bill amends *The Legislative Assembly Act*, R.S.A., 1942, chapter 4.

Section 1 of the Bill amends section 11 of the Act by adding a new subsection (3). The purpose of the amendment is to make it clear that a member of the Legislative Assembly may act as an agent for the Government Insurance Office without contravening the provisions of the earlier part of the section. The amendment also provides that the receipt of a bonus by a member of the Legislative Assembly with respect to goods produced by him and which is paid partly by the Dominion Government and partly by the Province, shall not affect his seat in the Legislature.

An Act to amend The Legislative Assembly Act.

(Assented to _____, 1944.)

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows:

1. *The Legislative Assembly Act*, being chapter 4 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1942, is hereby amended as to section 11 by adding at the end thereof the following new subsection:

“(3) This section shall not apply to any contract of agency between the Government Insurance Office and a member of the Legislative Assembly, nor to the receipt by a member of the Legislative Assembly of any bonus or bonuses paid under an agreement between the Government of Canada and the Province to any class of persons with respect to goods produced by them, notwithstanding, in either case, that any public money of the Province has been paid on account of such agency or on account of such bonus or bonuses.”

2. This Act shall come into force on the day upon which it is assented to.
