This being the first Day of the Third Session of the Twenty-Fourth Legislative Assembly of the Province of Alberta, for the despatch of business pursuant to a Proclamation of His Honour the Honourable H.A. "Bud" Olson, Lieutenant Governor, dated the the twenty-seventh day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ninety-nine;

#### **PROCLAMATION**

TO OUR FAITHFUL, the MEMBERS elected to serve in the Legislative Assembly of Our Province of Alberta and to each and every one of you, GREETING...

WHEREAS it is Our will and pleasure by and with the advice and consent of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Alberta to prorogue the Second Session of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of Alberta:

Paul Bourque, Deputy Minister of Justice and Deputy Attorney General WE DO hereby prorogue, effective February 15, 1999, the said Legislature; and

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient for certain causes and considerations to convene the Legislative Assembly of Our Province of Alberta for the Third Session of the Twenty-fourth Legislature, WE DO WILL that you and each of you, and all others in this

behalf interested, on TUESDAY, the 16th day of February, 1999, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the afternoon, at Our City of Edmonton, personally be and appear, for the despatch of business, to treat, act, do and conclude upon those things which, in the Legislature of Our Province of Alberta, by the Common Council of Our said Province, may, by the favour of God, be ordained.

The Speaker entered the Assembly and took the Chair. After delivering the opening day prayer and in recognition of the International Year of Older Persons, 1999, he invited the Central Lions Seniors Choir to lead the Members of the Assembly and guests in singing Canada's National Anthem.

While awaiting the arrival of His Honour the Honourable the Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker spoke about the various model parliaments conducted by a number of organizations in the Chamber outside of Session.

His Honour the Honourable the Lieutenant Governor entered the Assembly and took his seat on the Throne.

His Honour then read the following Speech from the Throne:

#### **Speech From The Throne**

Fellow Albertans, it is my privilege and my pleasure to welcome you to the Third Session of the Twenty-fourth Alberta Legislature.

On the eve of the year 2000, Alberta is strong. In responding to the challenges of further economic growth, and to the needs of the people it serves, my Government strives to strike the right balance. It will remain fiscally responsible. And it will keep working with Albertans on steady, targeted action on their priorities, especially health, education, the economy and the environment.

Our Government must make careful choices within the constraints of its budget, declining revenues and the uncertain global economy. It will continue to invest carefully in health, education, advanced education, social services and infrastructure. While protecting these areas, the Government will continue its leadership role in taxation. It will chart an innovative, new course, ensuring that Albertans' taxes remain the lowest in Canada. Our Government will maintain a balanced budget. And having worked towards paying off the net provincial debt during the next year, it will introduce a new debt repayment plan to see us into the new century.

In the first and foremost priority area of health, there will be a predictable funding base for the Province's 17 Regional Health Authorities, to help meet the needs of a growing and aging population. There will be more emphasis on preventing illness and injury, and on promoting healthy lifestyles, through efforts like a metabolic screening program for newborns. The Government will review mental health services for children, and improve the delivery of mental health services in our communities. Service will improve further in important areas like surgeries and diagnostics.

The Government will complete its review of long-term care. This review will feed into a broad initiative to assess the impact of an aging population on all Government programs for our seniors, and will help Alberta prepare to meet the challenges and opportunities presented by an aging population over the next 15 to 20 years. These efforts will culminate in a forum on seniors in late 1999, and are most appropriate in this, the International Year of Older Persons.

To improve patient care, our Government will continue to develop a province-wide system of health-related information. It will introduce new legislation to protect information related to Albertans' personal health. As well, there will be legislation to give Government further authority to protect our publicly funded health system. This will ensure the province's ability to comply with the Canada Health Act.

A provincial health summit, to be held later this month, will give recommendations on how to ensure that Albertans continue to have access to a high-quality, affordable and publicly sustainable health care system.

Children are our future, and a key priority for our Government. It will complete a new system of delivering more integrated and preventive services for children and families through 18 regional authorities, as part of the Children's Initiative. Several Government departments will coordinate their efforts through the Children's Secretariat. The Government will place more emphasis on early intervention, to prevent problems from occurring. It will promote the healthy development of young Albertans by monitoring key indicators of their health, such as the rate of babies with low birth weights, and by enabling students with special needs, like occupational therapy, to get the health care that they need, in their own school.

Our Government will provide further support for children in low-income families through the National Child Benefit program. It will boost efforts to find adoptive families for children in its permanent care. And it will host a forum on children's issues this fall to explore further ways to improve the well-being of our children.

The Government will reshape programs to help persons with disabilities participate more fully in society. It will act on the recommendations from the Summit on Lotteries and Gaming, including increasing problem gambling treatment and prevention, and establishing a gaming research institute, to examine issues related to gaming, which will provide the basis for future policies. And in a national context, it will continue to improve and clarify the relationship between governments on social policy; and to reform the Canada Pension Plan; and to work to improve the federal system as a whole.

Ensuring that our young people receive a quality education is another priority for Albertans. Our students are doing well, but the Government will focus further on literacy and computer literacy. Math teachers in junior and senior high schools will receive training to help students with the new math curriculum. Aboriginal children will get more access to curriculum and resources to meet their learning needs. Students who are in short-term institutional placements like custody for young offenders, and who have complex special needs, will have better access to these services. And an audit of the province's school buildings will lead to safer and healthier learning environments.

In Advanced Education, our Government aims to double the number of post-secondary students in the fields of computing, communications technology, physics and computer-related engineering over the next two years. To that end, there will be 23,000 more spaces for post-secondary students through the Access Fund. There will be a new, province-wide network of adult learning called Campus Alberta to make programs more accessible, and to create seamless pathways from diplomas through degrees, and between formal and informal continuing education.

Alberta's next priority is the economy. We can expect continued growth, but not at the robust levels of the last two years. In 1998, employment in our province grew by 57,000 jobs or nearly four per cent, the highest rate in Canada; our average unemployment rate was tied at a national low of 5.7 per cent; and there were 600 major capital projects valued at \$46 billion under construction.

Our Government will build on these successes by continuing to diversify our economy, especially in the development of new technologies. It will strive to increase the number of Albertans working in the information and communications technology sector from 40,000 today, to 75,000 by the year 2005. And it will promote the Alberta Advantage through efforts like the recently completed trade mission to the American Pacific Northwest and Mexico, and expanded training at the CNPC-Alberta Petroleum Centre in Beijing, which celebrates its tenth anniversary this year.

Our Government will work towards ensuring that all Alberta schools, businesses and homes have high-speed access to information, government services, lifelong learning and electronic commerce through the Internet by early in the next century. It will link municipalities, interested groups and government electronically, and upgrade aging computer systems.

Recognizing the importance of maintaining Alberta's infrastructure, our Government will begin to review the management of transportation facilities in this Province with a view to using funds most efficiently. It will continue work on the North-South Trade Corridor, including harmonized regulations for the movement of trucks from Canada to Mexico. It will encourage action on the recommendations in the Estey Report to improve the transportation of grain, and to save money for producers. It will reintroduce revised legislation consolidating all of its traffic safety laws, following further consultation with Albertans.

In the area of energy, customers will be able to choose their retailer of electricity, starting with major commercial enterprises on April 1, 1999. The Government will streamline the administration of oil sands tenure and mining approvals. It will improve geological information on minerals to attract increased investment. It will work with the federal and other provincial governments to settle the issue of jurisdiction over pipelines. In consultation with the industry, it will implement recommendations from its joint review of business rules for natural gas royalties, and it will create a policy on developing non-energy minerals.

The "agri" industry remains a significant contributor to Alberta's economy. Our Government continues to encourage the growth of agricultural value-added production. In agriculture, we will see a long-term strategy to monitor water quality, developed by Government, industry and other interested parties. There will be new provincial standards for the construction and operation of livestock feeding operations to complement municipal decisions on land use. After two and a half years of public consultation, the Government will introduce a new framework for the governance of irrigation districts. It will continue to support farmers with effective risk management tools such as the Farm Income Disaster Program, which is being emulated in other provinces. And our Government will bring together producers from Alberta and Montana to alleviate concerns over the movement of commodities across the international border.

There will be a new, more accountable framework for Alberta's tourism industry, overseen by a new Strategic Tourism Marketing Council. Reflecting the shared responsibility for marketing tourism, the Government will contract out marketing programs, while focusing on areas such as research and image control, and leading a joint effort with the private sector to raise Alberta's profile internationally. Our Government will take part in the 1999 International Travel Exposition in Kangwon, Korea, celebrating the 25th anniversary of Kangwon's twinning with our province.

In advanced technology, the Government will work with its partners in the postsecondary and industrial sectors to increase the research and development of new technologies in Alberta. There will be further partnerships to foster investment in key areas like biotechnology and information and communications technology, through the Science and Research Fund.

Further reforms to the governance, registration, continuing competence and conduct of professionals in the fields of health, accounting and forestry will make these procedures more transparent, while continuing to protect the public. Our Government will help to safeguard entitlements earned by members of employee pensions, and to ensure that employers and plan members are treated equitably. And it will modernize its insurance laws to benefit consumers through measures such as safeguarding the solvency of insurance companies, and removing barriers to competition in marketing.

Another priority for our Government is caring for Alberta's precious natural environment. To that end, it is reviewing the Province's environmental regulations to ensure that it maintains the most stringent standards in North America. The Government will strengthen further the protection of our natural heritage by consolidating legislation, and by revising its system of classes of protected areas and recreation areas, to clarify the purpose of, and the management of, sites within each class. It will convene a roundtable on climate change with interested Albertans to develop a plan to cut the emission of greenhouse gases, and to recommend a strategy for climate research and technology, emphasizing Alberta's environmental and energy advantage.

The Government will ensure that the high quality of water in Alberta is protected through the new Water Act, which took effect last month. It will investigate the feasibility of a program to help flood-prone communities to protect themselves. And it will complete four new sub-agreements harmonizing environmental legislation on a national basis.

In other important initiatives, our Government will present a new housing policy to address short-term pressures on, and the longer-term requirements of, Albertans with needs.

In this centennial year of the signing of Treaty 8, the Government will work with Ottawa to resolve outstanding claims under that treaty. Recognizing that aboriginal Albertans should have access to the same opportunities and quality of life as others, it will prepare a framework for aboriginal policy, clarifying Albertans' relationship with aboriginal people in the province, and encouraging capacity-building and self-reliance.

The Government will act on recommendations from the Justice Summit held last month. It will make it easier and more effective for separated and divorced parents to enforce court-ordered maintenance of, and access to, their children. It will target organized crime together with police chiefs and the R.C.M.P., through a provincial strategy starting this April 1.

Our Government will continue to support Alberta's thriving arts, libraries and cultural sectors, which contribute up to \$2 billion in economic activity each year, and are essential to its commitment to lifelong learning and a high quality of life for Albertans. Beginning this April 1, the new Film Development Grant Program will provide \$5 million in grants to support Alberta-based film-makers.

Having worked to combat the so-called Millennium Bug on a Government-wide basis since 1996, the Government will ensure that its computer systems are Year 2000-ready on schedule, by next month.

And our Government will continue to listen to Albertans and give them further links to Government, such as a permanent toll-free telephone number, secondly, a new site on the Internet, and thirdly, quarterly reporting incorporating information in addition to its finances.

Fellow Albertans, we are blessed to live in a province which is the pride of a country repeatedly declared by the United Nations to have the highest quality of life in the world. Our Government thanks our municipalities, our teachers and school boards, our health care professionals, our police services, our volunteers, and our community organizations, and everyone else who has worked so hard to serve the people of this magnificent Province.

My Government will keep working with Albertans to strike the right balance; to provide quality programs and services at a sustainable cost; and to build an even better Alberta as we approach a new century, and a new millennium.

Now I leave you to the business of this Session, confident that as elected representatives, you will in every way fulfil your responsibilities to Albertans.

Mr. Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly, I pray that the blessing of God may rest on your deliberations.

God bless Alberta. God bless Canada. God save the Oueen.

#### Motion for Adjournment for an Emergency Debate

Mrs. MacBeth, Hon. Leader of the Official Opposition, requested leave to move, pursuant to Standing Order 30, that the Assembly adjourn to discuss a matter of urgent public importance, namely the crisis created by the shortage of acute care hospital beds in Calgary and Edmonton.

#### **Speaker's Statement** — Deputy Government House Leader

Honourable Members, the Chair would like to make a brief statement related to the appointment of the Honourable Member from Medicine Hat as Deputy Government House Leader. Although this position has typically been held by a member of Executive Council, there is nothing in our rules that prevents a Private Member from occupying the post. In fact, the Standing Orders of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta are silent on the position of Deputy Government House Leader. The Chair's research indicates that designating a Private Member to the position is not unique in Canada. There are certain functions, however, that under our Standing Orders and by convention may only be performed by members of Executive Council or, in other words, by a Minister. In an effort to be fair to the Honourable Member and to ensure that the time of the House is not taken up by questions later on, the Chair would like to review the scope of the Member's activities as Deputy Government House Leader.

In general, it is the Chair's view that any activity that may be performed by the Government House Leader under our Standing Orders may be performed by the Deputy Government House Leader. Where the Standing Orders are silent as to who may do something, it is assumed that a Private Member can perform the function unless there is a convention or longstanding practice to the contrary. Accordingly, a Private Member may, as Deputy Government House Leader:

- move adjournment motions including those indicated in Standing Orders 4(1) and 4(3);
- provide information on Thursdays concerning projected Government Business pursuant to Standing Order 7(5);
- on Tuesdays, give notice of which Written Questions or Motions for Returns will be dealt with the following day as referred to in Standing Order 34(2)(a);
- on Wednesdays, when the item is called by the Clerk under Orders of the Day, move the motion regarding which Written Questions or Motions for Returns will be taken up that day and which ones will stand and retain their places;
- move Second or Third readings of Government Bills except Bills requiring the Royal Recommendation as being money Bills under Standing Order 79, or those Bills which are tax Bills and must be moved by a Minister;
- if required, move the motion that the House resolve itself into Committee of Supply or Committee of the Whole.

Given the requirements in our Standing Orders and practices of this Assembly, there are certain things that may not be done by a Private Member such as:

- move motions appearing on the Order Paper under Government Motions as these may only be placed on the Order Paper by a Minister;
- move any closure motions pursuant to Standing Order 21;
- accept, reject or amend Written Questions or Motions for Returns as under Standing Order 34 this may only be done by a member of the Executive Council;
- move a supply resolution relating to a portion of the estimates under Standing Order 57(7);
- move motions under Standing Order 58(6) to determine:
  - (a) the number of days that the Committee of Supply and its subcommittees may be called, or
  - (b) the dates and the number of departments' estimates that may be designated by the Leader of the Official Opposition for consideration by the Committee of Supply;
- move that a Bill introduced by a Private Member be placed on the Order Paper under Government Bills and Orders as under Standing Order 71 that must be done by a member of the Executive Council;
- as previously indicated, move a money Bill or a tax Bill.

It is the Chair's hope that this list is comprehensive enough to address the matters that will concern the House during this Session. The Chair would also like to offer congratulations to the new Government House Leader, the Honourable Minister of Intergovernmental and Aboriginal Affairs, and to the Honourable Member for Calgary Buffalo who is the new Opposition House Leader. The Chair, the Chairman of Committees and the Deputy Chairman of Committees look forward to working with these individuals who, together with the Honourable Member for Edmonton Strathcona, have the primary responsibility on behalf of their respective caucuses for the conduct of the business in this Assembly.

The background that I give you is that when you walk out of these doors later in the day you will see something to the left of you, and I want to provide what this was all about. This squadron, that is, the City of Edmonton 418, had a distinguished record of service in war and in peace. It was formed in England in November of 1941. The 418 was involved in air operation until the war's end. Their wartime exploits were absolutely remarkable. On 3,492 sorties, squadron 418 destroyed 178 Nazi aircraft. Sixteen of its pilots were aces with five or more enemy aircraft to their credit. This squadron accounted for more Nazi aircraft than any other unit in the Royal Canadian Air Force. They also paid a heavy price. One hundred twenty-five squadron members were killed in action and a further 27 were declared missing in action and presumed dead. In March of 1944, 418 was adopted by the city of Edmonton as many of the ground and air crew were from Edmonton and the surrounding area. The 418 squadron standard is unique. Central to it is the figure of an Inuit hunter. Beneath the Inuit is the motto "Piyautailili" which translates "defend even until death."

The standard is a consecrated symbol of the unit's achievements in war, an expression of the Sovereign's and the nation's gratitude and of the sanctity of the sacrifices given to the cause of freedom. The 418 squadron is laid up at the balustrade to the left as you exit the Chamber, and I'd encourage all hon. Members to take pause and to briefly reflect on its significance as they leave the House later this afternoon. One of the aces of this squadron is a former minister of the Social Credit government who sat on the front benches in this House for a great number of years, Mr. Fred Colborne.

I'm also pleased to announce the appointment of Mr. Ed Richard and Mr. Bill Semple as assistant Sergeants-at-Arms with the Alberta Legislative Assembly. These sessional appointments were made necessary after the retirement of Allen Gowler in May of this year. Mr. Gowler had served as associate Sergeant-at-Arms for over 18 years, and I know that all of you in the next number of days will be able to welcome Bill and Ed to their new responsibilities and wish them well.

In the next number of days, the next number of nights, hon. Members will also notice some new faces at the Table directly in front of me. Jo-An Christiansen, Micheline Gravel, Corinne Dacyshyn, and Diane Shumyla will be spending some time in the Chamber learning the duties of Table Officers. Although new to the Table, they nevertheless have between them a total of 25.95 years of service to the Legislative Assembly Office in various capacities including: Journals and Bills Clerk, Committee Clerk, Procedural Clerk, and Library Technician. It is not to say that any of the current Table Officers are leaving; I just believe that we should have bonafide qualified backup for all of us, and, in the unlikely event that one of the Table Officers is unable to be here with us, we will have dutifully qualified other people. I'm sure hon. Members will also welcome them.

And the last item: hon. Members will note a few changes to today's Order Paper pursuant to recent appointments to Executive Council. Parliamentary authorities provide that a Minister cannot be the sponsor of private Member's business. Thus, following the written request by the hon. Member for Edmonton-Mill Creek and new Associate Minister of Health and Wellness, Motions Other Than Government Motions 573 and 585 which had appeared on the Order Paper under his name have been withdrawn. This leaves Bill Pr. 2, Shaw Communications Inc. Amendment Act, 1999, still showing on the Order Paper, also under the new Associate Minister's name. Pursuant to Beauchesne's 1061(1) which states that "it is a recognized principle in Parliament that Ministers should not initiate or promote private bill legislation," and also in keeping with the parliamentary traditions of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, unanimous consent of the Assembly is required to effect a change in the sponsorship of this bill. However, I understand that the Deputy Chair of the Standing Committee on Private Bills has some information on the bill which she would like to share with hon. Members.

Mrs. Burgener, Deputy Chair, Select Standing Committee on Private Bills, indicated the Committee had received correspondence from the counsel to the petitioners for Bill Pr2, Shaw Communications Inc. Amendment Act, 1999, advising that the petitioners wished to withdraw the Bill from the Assembly's business. She then tabled the letter in question:

# **Speaker's Ruling** — Question of Privilege Raised by the Member for Edmonton-Strathcona

Last Wednesday, November 17, 1999, the honourable Member for Edmonton Strathcona raised a purported question of privilege under Standing Order 15(5). The event giving rise to this question of privilege occurred sometime just before the noon hour that day. Therefore, the two hour written requirement of Standing Order 15(2) could not be met. The Chair finds that this matter was raised at the earliest opportunity.

The event, as described by the Member for Edmonton Strathcona, was that a replacement reporter for the Calgary Herald was escorted in the Legislature Building by a person the Member calls "a bodyguard". The purported question of privilege is that the person's presence in the Legislature Building somehow breached the privileges of the Assembly or is a contempt of the House.

As the Chair understands the matter, the Government House Leader, who is also the Minister of Justice and Attorney General and responsible for the security staff of the Building as distinct from the Assembly, indicated that when the security staff were advised of the "bodyguard's" presence, they advised that individual that it was not appropriate to be performing his duties in the Building and he left.

The responsibility for the security of the Building does not lie with the Speaker but the Department of Justice and Attorney General. The Assembly's jurisdiction is over the precincts which includes part of the Legislature Building and the Legislature Annex. However, it is important to observe that, as Joseph Maingot states in Parliamentary Privilege in Canada (2nd edition) at p. 171, "It is the function of the precincts that is "sacred" and not its location."

The Chair wants to make very clear that the individual did not enter the Assembly, but only the Building, and to the Chair's knowledge, there was no effect on the proceedings of the Assembly.

The Chair notes that this is an interesting twist on what may be seen as a more familiar purported question of privilege where someone is denied access to the Legislature Building. Perhaps if this person had been denied access to the Building, instead of being admitted, someone might be making just that case. To the Chair's knowledge, usually Legislatures and Parliaments do not come under criticism for allowing people in.

In any event, there is no right to have access to either the Building, security for which is provided by a branch of the Department of Justice and Attorney General, or the galleries of the Assembly. In this case, the admission of the individual to the Building was in keeping with normal practices. While no one has a right to enter this or any other public building, the tendency is to allow admission whenever possible.

If the Chair may be allowed to express a view, and keeping in mind that the Chair does not exercise authority over the Building security, only the Assembly and its precincts, it is the Chair's profound hope that the presence of any visitor in this Building is not ever intended or perceived as being intimidating or threatening. The Chair points out that, in this case, there is no evidence that the individual in question threatened or assaulted anyone.

Whether the person was refused or granted admission to the Building is not a prima facie question of privilege. In the Chair's view, it is likely only where a Member or an Officer of the Assembly is denied access to the precincts that a valid question of privilege would arise. Accordingly, there are no further proceedings on this matter.
