To: Bob Pritchard Re: Alberta Electoral Boundaries

My proposal is the same as was made to the federal government. Representation – boundaries – should be strictly based upon representation by population: one person, one vote; i.e. for an Alberta population of 2,490,000 and 83 MLAs, each MLA should represent 30,000 plus/minus 5 percent persons. Note: actually this figure likely would be reduced somewhat because the highly unlikely possibility may prevail that only those of voting age should be counted. Where the feeling that rural areas, because of their physically large land areas, should have more representation, then they could get extra dollars to have an assistant to travel around their constituency to visit the constituents. The one person, one vote concept is the best and fairest that we have come up with to date.
