

## PARTIAL TRANSCRIPT

MR. MILLER: Mr. Chairman, I move that we concur with the actions being taken.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Thank you very much. There we are; we have a motion. We are now four. We are about to discuss this motion. Is there any further discussion on the motion?

MR. THOMPSON: Question.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Thank you. The question on the motion that we support the Auditor General in his action: those in favour? The motion is carried unanimously.

MR. ROGERS: Thank you very much indeed, gentlemen.

MR. MILLER: These things happen.

MR. ROGERS: No. Perhaps a signature on . . .

MR. SALMON: On the document we gave you.

MR. ROGERS: . . . the document, which is simply an authorization so Treasury will process the payment.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Do I have a document?

MR. SALMON: That document was sent last . . .

MR. ROGERS: I have some copies in case it was needed.

MR. SALMON: We have the original with the stationery, but that will work.

MR. ROGERS: Do you need another copy of that for your files, Bob?

MR. CHAIRMAN: Yes please.

All right. We're going to let you go, but I'm going to hold the other two gentlemen for one more minute.

MR. MILLER: You don't need a motion to adjourn?

MR. CHAIRMAN: We don't need a motion. If we have another two minutes . . .

MRS. EMPSON: We do have a motion. We have to approve the minutes of January 31, and he's gone.

MR. CHAIRMAN: He did before he left. We had unanimous approval.

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
