- (b) reaffirm the principle articulated by the Supreme Court of Canada in *the* 1998 *Reference re Secession of Quebec* that it is "the constitutional right of each participant in the federation to initiate constitutional change," and that "this right implies a reciprocal duty on the other participants to engage in discussions to address any legitimate initiative to change the constitutional order,"
- (c) authorize an amendment to the Constitution of Canada to be made by proclamation issued by Her Excellency the Governor General under the Great Seal of Canada in accordance with the Schedule set forth below, and
- (d) direct the Government of Alberta to take all necessary steps to secure a fair deal for Alberta in the Canadian federation, including the reform of federal transfer programs, the defence of provincial powers enumerated in the Constitution, and the right to pursue responsible development of natural resources.

#### AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF CANADA

- 1. The *Constitution Act, 1982* is amended by repealing subsection 36(2) thereof.
- 2. This Amendment may be cited as the *Constitution Amendment*, [year of proclamation].

Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly recognize the critical role of agriculture in Alberta's economy and urge the Government to take steps to ensure that Alberta's agriculture and agri-food industries are essential components of the economic recovery plan in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

**524**. Ms Lovely to propose the following motion:

Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to recognize the important work of rural veterinarians and explore ways to increase the number of veterinarians serving rural communities.

525. Mr. Smith to propose the following motion:

Be it resolved that the Assembly urge the Government to consider taking the necessary steps to develop an incentive framework designed to assist in supporting the profitability of small and medium-sized oil and gas companies in Alberta while maintaining provincial and federal environmental standards.

526. Mr. Reid to propose the following motion:

Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to introduce amendments to the Traffic Safety Act to expand the prohibition under section 115(2)(t) of the Act to apply to a driver of a vehicle on a highway that passes an emergency vehicle or tow truck that is stopped on that highway and operating its flashing lamps, regardless of the traffic lane used to pass, or the direction of travel when passing.
