Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to introduce amendments to the Traffic Safety Act to expand the prohibition under section 115(2)(t) of the Act to apply to a driver of a vehicle on a highway that passes an emergency vehicle or tow truck that is stopped on that highway and operating its flashing lamps, regardless of the traffic lane used to pass, or the direction of travel when passing.

- (c) no later than 9 months after the beginning of the Committee's review, the Committee must submit a report on its review to the Legislative Assembly that sets out the Committee's recommendations, if any.
