Rev. Mr. Roberts, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Centre, presented a petition from Alberta residents urging the Government to increase home care services.

Mrs. Gagnon, Hon. Member for Calgary-McKnight, presented a petition from 1,122 students and other Albertans requesting the Government to stop the erosion of quality and accessibility in Alberta colleges, universities, and technical institutes.

Mr. Mitchell, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Meadowlark, presented a petition from 231 students expressing their concern to the Government regarding the possibility of a strike by Edmonton Separate School Board teachers and its impact on education.

On request by Mr. Hawkesworth, Hon. Member for Calgary-Mountain View, the following petition was read and received:

The undersigned request legislation to delay all proposed pulp and other forestry developments in the Province of Alberta until such time as:

- (1) a class environmental assessment that reports the cumulative impact of all existing and proposed forestry developments has been completed, and
- (2) full and complete environmental impact assessments, equivalent to the Federal Environmental Assessment Review Process (SOR/84-467) including public hearings, have been completed for each proposed forestry development.

Bill 1 Premier's Council on Science and Technology Act — Hon. Mr. Getty

The following amendment to the Bill was moved by Mr. Bruseker:

The Bill is hereby amended as follows:

A. Section 4 is amended:

- a. by striking out the proposed subsection (5) and substituting
 - (5) The Members appointed pursuant to subsection (4) shall be appointed from a list provided by the Edmonton and Calgary Councils for Advanced Technology, the President of the University of Alberta, the President of the University of Calgary, the President of the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology, and the President of the Southern Alberta Institute of Technology, acting jointly.
- b. by striking out the proposed subsection (7) and substituting
 - (7) The first Members appointed pursuant to subsection (4) shall be appointed in such a way that half of them are appointed for a term of 2 years and half for a term of 4 years and thereafter Members appointed shall be appointed for a term of 4 years.
- B. Section 6(1) is amended by striking out "twice" and substituting "6 times."
- C. Section 7 is struck out and the following substituted:
 - This Act expires on a date set by order of the Lieutenant Governor in Council.
