- (2) What is the total amount paid to the Government by the energy sector for the purposes above on public lands under disposition for grazing leases and community pastures, and what percentage was paid to the leaseholder(s) and what percentage was retained by the Government for each of the last five fiscal years?

- (3) What is the total amount paid to the Government by the energy sector for the purposes above on public lands subject to forest management agreements and timber quotas, and what percentage was paid to the leaseholder(s) and what percentage was retained by the Government for each of the last five fiscal years?

295. Mr. Pashak to propose the following motion:

That an Order of the Assembly do issue for a Return showing:

An itemized list showing the amount paid to the Government by the energy sector for mineral surface leases, pipeline right of ways, and seismic exploration contracts under each grazing lease, forest reserve lease, community pasture lease, timber quota lease, and forest management agreement lease, and in each instance what percentage paid went to the leaseholders and what percentage was retained by the Government for each of the last five fiscal years?
