Written Questions

330. Mr. Mitchell to ask the Government:

When coniferous timber quota certificates CTQR030004, CTQR030005, CTQR040013, and CTQE050003 were issued to Sundance Forest Industries Ltd. (formerly Erith-Tie Co. Ltd.) in 1988, one of the conditions attached was that a sawmill requiring a minimum capital expenditure of \$10 million must be constructed. Has the Government carried out an audit to ensure that the company has spent or is spending this sum on new construction? If not, when does the Government intend to carry out such an audit?

331. Rev. Mr. Roberts to propose the following motion:

That an Order of the Assembly do issue for a Return showing:
Copies of all studies undertaken in the last 18 months by the Department of Health to determine the health status of Albertans relating to:

- (1) physical and mental health indicators,
- (2) children, adults, and the elderly,
- (3) various geographical areas of the province, and
- (4) the setting of targets for improvement of health status.

332. Rev. Mr. Roberts to propose the following motion:

That an Order of the Assembly do issue for a Return showing:
Copies of studies in support of the Minister of Health's contention that increases in health premium taxes "creates an awareness on the part of an individual ... of the realities of our health care system" (Hansard, p.1171, May 10, 1990).

333. Mr. Sigurdson to propose the following motion:

That an Order of the Assembly do issue for a Return showing:

- (1) The total number of Workers' Compensation Board claims filed by welders for the period 1980-1989, or, if the number for this period is not available, for the period 1986-1989;
- (2) the total number of claims allowed for welders by the WCB during the time period provided under (1);
- (3) the total amount of money paid to welders for claims allowed by the WCB for the time period provided under (1); and,
- (4) the average amount of money awarded to welders with successful claims allowed by the WCB for the time period provided under (1).
