Motion for Adjournment for an Emergency Debate

Mr. Taylor, Hon. Member for Westlock-Sturgeon, requested leave to move, pursuant to Standing Order 30, that the Assembly adjourn to discuss a matter of urgent public importance, namely the recent proposals to export Alberta's water to the United States.

The Speaker ruled that the request for leave was not in order.

Motion Under Standing Order 40

Mr. Gibeault, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Millwoods, requested the unanimous consent of the Assembly for consideration of the following motion:

Be it resolved that, since June 17 to 23 is Occupational Health and Safety Week in Canada and, in light of the fact that tens of thousands of Alberta workers continue to be injured and killed on the job, the Legislative Assembly direct the Standing Committee on Public Affairs to conduct full public hearings across the province to identify areas requiring improvement in terms of occupational health and safety legislation, regulations, standards, and enforcement.

Unanimous consent was not granted.

"Bill 37, Alberta Government Telephones Reorganization Act, be not now read a Second time, because this House believes in the principle of a public utility being operated with a primary mandate of serving the interests of the public in a fair, equitable, and affordable fashion, which could be superseded by the Bill, which makes possible providing handsome profit opportunities for the shareholders, who could be as few as 20 individuals or corporations."

Mr. Ewasiuk, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Beverly, moved that the amendment be amended by adding after "20 individuals or corporations":

", and because this House believes that any foreign ownership or partial ownership of a public utility in Alberta is wholly inappropriate."
