Bill 35 Metis Settlements Act — Ms Calahasen

Mr. Hawkesworth, Hon. Member for Calgary-Mountain View, moved that the Bill be amended as follows:

- A. Section 176 is struck out and the following is substituted:
 - (1) "If the Minister considers that the affairs of a settlement are managed in an irregular, improper or improvident manner, the Minister may request the Lieutenant Governor in Council to cause an inquiry under the Public Inquiries Act."
 - (2) "If the report of the commissioner or commissioners appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council confirms that the affairs of a settlement are managed in an irregular, improper or improvident manner, the Minister may, by order,
 - (a) dismiss the settlement council or particular councillors or an employee or official of the settlement, or
 - (b) direct the settlement council or an employee or official of the settlement to take any action that the Minister considers proper in the circumstances."
