The following Bill was taken under consideration:

Bill 26 Utility Companies Income Tax Rebates Amendment Act, 1990 — Hon. Mr. Johnston

Debate continued on the amendment moved by Mr. Doyle, Hon. Member for West Yellowhead, on June 21, 1990. The amendment to the motion read as follows:

A. The following is added after section 2:

2.1 The Public Utilities Board, shall, prior to December 31, 1990, hold public hearings into the provisions of section 3 and shall submit a report on the hearings to the Provincial Treasurer who shall table it at the earliest opportunity in the Legislative Assembly.

B. Section 2 commences on Proclamation which shall not be earlier than 30 days following the tabling of a report by the Provincial Treasurer under section 2.1

Mr. McInnis, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Jasper Place, moved that the amendment be amended as follows:

A. In item A, in the proposed section 2.1 by adding after "provisions of section 3":

"and the need for strategies to combat global warming,"
