Be it resolved that the interim report, and recommendations contained therein, presented to the Assembly on March 21, 1990, by the Select Special Committee on Electoral Boundaries, appointed pursuant to Motion 14 passed by this Assembly on August 15, 1989, be now received and concurred in, and if the Assembly is not sitting when the final report of the Committee is completed, the Committee shall make it public by delivering a copy to the Speaker and all members of the Assembly and subsequently releasing it to the general public.

Debate continued on the amendment moved by Mr. McInnis, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Jasper Place, on June 28, 1990. The amendment to the motion read as follows:

by striking out all the words after "that" and substituting:

"this House regrets that the Select Special Committee on Electoral Boundaries has been unable to complete its consideration of the appropriateness of the provisions of the Electoral Boundaries Commission Act and that it directs the committee to prepare a recommended timetable for the completion of the process leading to the commencement of enumeration on the new electoral boundaries not later than September 15, 1991."

The question being put, the amendment was defeated.

 - review regulations issued by the Minister or the (b) Lieutenant Governor in Council and report on them;
 - investigate and hear appeals under this Act.
