Speaker's Ruling

The Speaker made the following ruling:

Motion 222 on the Order Paper proposed by the Honourable Member for Edmonton-Glengarry is substantially the same in subject matter to Government Motion 20 (Select Special Committee on Parliamentary Reform) which was passed by the Assembly.

As a result, Motion 222 cannot stand. Authority for this is Beauchesne's, paragraph 563, which reads:

A debate on a motion effectively blocks debate on another notice of motion when both deal with essentially the same subject matter.

and Beauchesne's paragraph 558(1):

An old rule of Parliament reads: "That a question being once made and carried in the affirmative or negative, cannot be questioned again but must stand as the judgment of the House." Unless such a rule were in existence, the time of the House might be used in the discussion of a motion of the same nature and contradictory decisions would sometimes be arrived at in the course of the same session.

As a consequence, Motion 222 is redundant and the Chair is obliged to withdraw it from the Order Paper.
