Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to implement Joint Work Site Health and Safety Committees: to assure worker's rights to know the hazards they are dealing with; to enable participation of workers in the development and implementation of safety procedures, programs, and standards; and to permit workers the opportunity to refuse to do any unsafe work, without suffering prejudice or penalty.

233. Moved by Ms Barrett:

Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to transform the mental health system from one which relies heavily on institutional care to one rooted in community by completing a comprehensive system of effective community-based mental health services which take into account the full spectrum of needs of people who suffer from mental illness and their families, and to include provision of: appropriate mental health intervention and emergency services; greater use of psychiatric units of regional and general hospitals; proper coordination of services at the local level; and provision of adequate income and housing options for people who suffer from mental illness.
