#### **237.** Moved by Rev. Mr. Roberts:

Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to create an independent commission to review the role and responsibilities of MLAs and then establish salaries, benefits, and a review mechanism commensurate with the role; such commission to have the following membership: a judge from the Court of Queen's Bench, and representatives of the public including the Alberta Chamber of Commerce, the Alberta Federation of Labour, associations of Alberta municipalities, and groups representing people living on fixed incomes.

A debate followed.

Mr. Nelson moved adjournment of the debate, which was agreed to.

Hon. Mr. Kowalski requested the unanimous consent of the Assembly for consideration of Government Motion No. 39.

Unanimous consent to proceed was not granted.
