What is the breakdown of the \$1.7 million provision for loss for the estimated costs of lease obligations in excess of estimated sublease revenues by specific property held by the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission as of March 31, 1997, as contained in the Public Accounts 1996/97, Vol. 3, notes 13 and 14, pages 191-192?

WQ9. Moved by Dr. Pannu:

How does the Government explain the fact that the Heritage Trust Fund's Annual Report for 1996-97 indicates an overall rate of return of 8.5% for the Fund's investments when the Public Accounts for the same year (schedule 6, page 37) states the average "effective yield" is 3.63% for securities maturing within a year and 5.52% for securities maturing in 1 to 35 years on the bulk of our financial assets?

What is the main reason or reasons why Alberta Treasury Branch guarantees increased \$351 million, that is from \$125 million to \$476 million, in the 1994-95 fiscal year (see Contingent Liabilities, note 14, page 22, Alberta Treasury Branch's Annual Report) and what provisions for losses have been made or will be made in the future on this contingent liability?
