Hon. Mr. Stelmach, Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Development, made a statement recognizing Farm Safety Week, March 11 to 18, 1998, the contribution of the agriculture industry to Alberta's economy, and the need for education to prevent injury and fatalities on the farm.
