and by adding the following after "percentage of federal tax":

when it is affordable within the context of a balanced budget; it does not result in an unfair distribution of the tax burden on middle income and low income Albertans; and it does not have to be paid for by cuts to public health care and education. The Deputy Speaker ruled that the amendment was not in order.
