Monday, March 15, 1999

The Speaker took the Chair at 1:30 p.m.

The Speaker made a statement in recognition of the 93rd anniversary of the First Session of the First Legislature of the Province of Alberta which was convened on March 15, 1906 and held in Edmonton's Thistle Curling Rink. Since March 15, 1906, Members of the Legislative Assembly have spent over 1,010,000 minutes in parliamentary deliberations.

Presenting Petitions
