Ms Haley, Hon. Member for Airdrie-Rocky View, moved that the motion be amended by deleting all the words after the word "that" and substituting the following:

Bill 205, Municipal Government (Farming Practices Protection) Amendment Act, 2001 be not now read a Second time, but that it be read a Second time this day six months hence.

On the motion that the following Bill be now read a Second time:

Bill 206 Regional Health Authorities Conflicts of Interest Act — Ms Carlson on behalf of Dr. Nicol

#### **Motions Other Than Government Motions**

## **503.** Moved by Dr. Nicol:

Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to prepare annually a detailed cost-benefit analysis of the impact of electricity deregulation on the utility bills on all classes of customers in Alberta which must be released to the public.

A debate followed.

The question being put, the motion was defeated.

#### **504.** Moved by Mr. Yankowsky (Amended):

Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to *investigate* the possibility of creating a prosperity dividend payable to all Alberta residents that is similar to the Alaska Permanent Fund Dividend program.

A debate followed.

Mr. McClelland, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Rutherford, moved the motion be amended by striking out "that is similar to the Alaska Permanent Fund Dividend program".

The question being put, the amendment was agreed to.

The question being put, the motion as amended was agreed to.

The following item of business was not taken up when called:

#### **505.** Mr. Herard to propose the following motion:

Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to treat smoking as an addiction worthy of similar treatment and support systems as currently exist for other addictions.

At 4:17 p.m. the Deputy Speaker requested the unanimous consent of the Assembly to waive Standing Order 8(2)(c) in order to proceed to Government Bills and Orders. Unanimous consent to proceed was not granted.

### **506.** Moved by Ms Kryczka:

Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to identify palliative care as a core service in each Regional Health Authority to ensure the availability of a coordinated continuum of care and support services for end-of-life care with access to palliative community services (palliative home and hospice care), acute care, consultation services for physicians, staff and patients, and tertiary care.

Pursuant to Standing Order 8(2)(c), debate adjourned, Ms Kryczka speaking.
