## **Motions Other Than Government Motions**

501. Moved by Mr. Griffiths:

Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly urge the Government to eliminate the education portion of property taxes and fund education through general revenue, thereby freeing up financial resources for municipalities to adequately provide required services.

A debate followed.

Mr. McFarland, Hon. Member for Little Bow, moved the motion be amended as follows:

(a) by striking out "to eliminate" and substituting "to phase-out";

(b) by striking out "and fund education through general revenue," and substituting "over a 10 year period, gradually supplementing the loss from alternative sources,".

A debate followed on the amendment.

The question being put, the amendment was agreed to.



Debate continued on the main motion.

Pursuant to Standing Order 8(3), debate adjourned.
