The Speaker requested and received the unanimous consent of the Assembly to waive Standing Order 7(1.1) in order to proceed with Ministerial Statements.

Ministerial Statements

Hon. Mr. Blackett, Minister of Culture and Community Spirit, made a statement recognizing November 27, 2010, as Ukrainian Famine and Genocide (Holodomor) Memorial Day.

Mr. MacDonald, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Gold Bar, commented on the statement.

The Speaker requested and received the unanimous consent of the Assembly to allow Mr. Hinman, Hon. Member for Calgary-Glenmore, and Mr. Mason, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Highlands-Norwood, to comment on the Ministerial Statement.

Speaker's Statement - Members' Anniversaries

The Speaker made a statement recognizing November 22, 2010, as the sixth anniversary of 15 Members of the Legislative Assembly being elected to the Legislative Assembly of Alberta and the first anniversary of Mr. Hinman, Hon.
