## **Presenting Petitions**

Dr. Morton, Hon. Member for Foothills-Rocky View, presented a petition from 2,077 Albertans urging the Government to introduce legislation granting charter schools: 1. the opportunity for charter schools to continue to offer unique approaches to public education with their primary purpose being to provide parents with innovative choices that best serve the educational needs of their child(ren), 2. a fair and equitable process for establishing charter schools through direct application to the Minister of Education, 3. the ability to be granted "earned permanence" as determined by Alberta Education evaluations, 4. the opportunity to respond to parents who wish to exercise choice through the elimination of charter school enrollment caps, 5. the recognition that charter schools are best governed by their own boards of directors, elected according to their own bylaws, and 6. the right for charter school teachers not to be required to be members of the Alberta Teachers' Association.

Ms Pastoor, Hon. Member for Lethbridge-East, presented a petition from 100 Lethbridge and area residents urging the Government to consider increasing the funding to the Ministry of Education so that sustainable and adequate funding is provided to address the needs of every student, every day, no exceptions.
