#### **Members' Statements**

Mr. Ellis, Hon. Member for Calgary-West, made a statement honouring the service of Maurice White, Leonard Corbett, Bernard Cooper, Henry Planger, and Lloyd Lewis, Albertans who served in the First Special Service Force, also known as the Devil's Brigade, during the Second World War and thanking the men and women who serve in our Armed Forces.

Dr. Swann, Hon. Member for Calgary-Mountain View, made a statement regarding violence against women, women's shelters, and inadequate Government funding for families to afford alternate accommodation.

Mr. Weadick, Hon. Member for Lethbridge-West, made a statement regarding Unlimited, a dance collaboration hosted by the University of Lethbridge from March 17 to 21, 2015, which includes students with developmental disabilities, and congratulating the University of Lethbridge for its initiative to proactively include people with disabilities in a for-credit university drama course.

Ms Smith, Hon.
