Speaker's Statement – Clerk of the Legislative Assembly

The Speaker made a statement announcing the appointment of Robert H. Reynolds, QC, as the seventh Clerk of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, effective April 4, 2016.

The Deputy Speaker also made a statement and introduced Mr. Reynolds' family. Hon. Mr. Mason, Government House Leader, Mr. Cooper, Official Opposition House Leader, Dr. Starke, Hon. Member for Vermilion-Lloydminster, Dr. Swann, Hon. Member for Calgary-Mountain View, and Mr. Clark, Hon. Member for Calgary-Elbow, then congratulated Mr. Reynolds.

The Speaker requested and received the unanimous consent of the Assembly to waive Standing Order 7(1.1) in order to complete Introduction of Guests.

Members' Statements

Dr. Turner, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Whitemud, made a statement regarding seven-year-old Mable Tooke, also known as "Spider Mable, local superhero," who suffers from acute lymphoblastic leukemia, and recognizing April 2016 as Daffodil Month in support of those living with cancer.

Mr. Fildebrandt, Hon. Member for Strathmore-Brooks, made a statement regarding the Hope Bridges Society in Strathmore, which uses the arts to support seniors, new Canadians, and those with learning disabilities.

Mr. McIver, Hon. Leader of the Progressive Conservative Opposition, made a statement regarding Engage, a new Progressive Conservative caucus initiative to seek frank and open feedback from Albertans in order to make suggestions for positive change to the Government.

Ms Goehring, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Castle Downs, made a statement regarding the work of the North Edmonton Football Association and the Edmonton Seahawks youth football club based in the Edmonton-Castle Downs constituency.

Mr. Rosendahl, Hon. Member for West Yellowhead, made a statement regarding lignin, an alternative to petroleum-based resin, the construction of Canada's first lignin recovery plant, and the work of West Fraser Mills, Hinton Pulp, along with its partners, to encourage its use.

Mr. Orr, Hon. Member for Lacombe-Ponoka, made a statement regarding the many tourism opportunities in Alberta and how the carbon tax may affect tourism consumer costs.
