The Speaker took the Chair at 1:30 p.m.

The Speaker offered a prayer, and a moment of silence was observed in recognition of the death of former Member Mr. Bohan "Bud" Zip, Member for Calgary-Mountain View from 1982 to 1986, who passed away on April 19, 2017.

Ministerial Statements

Hon. Ms Gray, Minister of Labour and Minister Responsible for Democratic Renewal, made a statement recognizing April 28, 2017, as the Day of Mourning, which honours workers killed, injured, or disabled at the workplace, and regarding the Government signing the Westray Memorandum of Understanding on April 28, 2017, along with 10 provincial police forces.

Mr. van Dijken, Hon. Member for Barrhead-Morinville-Westlock, commented on the statement.

Hon. Mr. Mason, Government House Leader, requested and received the unanimous consent of the Assembly to allow the Leader of the Progressive Conservative Opposition, the Member for Calgary-Mountain View, and the Member for Calgary-Elbow to comment on the Ministerial Statement.

Mr. McIver, Hon. Leader of the Progressive Conservative Opposition, Dr. Swann, Hon. Member for Calgary-Mountain View, and Mr. Clark, Hon. Member for Calgary-Elbow, then commented on the statement.
