Mr. Hinkley, Hon. Member for Wetaskiwin-Camrose, made a statement regarding how Alberta's energy sector is transforming toward renewable energy, particularly wind power, which has been a source of greenhouse gas reductions, jobs, and new income in rural Alberta.
