# **Members' Statements**

MLA Connolly, Hon. Member for Calgary-Hawkwood, made a statement regarding the construction progress on the Calgary Cancer Centre.

Mrs. Pitt, Hon. Member for Airdrie, made a statement regarding the importance of a sustainable funding model for nurse practitioners and encouraged the Government to act on this issue.

MLA McPherson, Hon. Member for Calgary-Mackay-Nose Hill, made a statement regarding the prevalence of sexual assault and sexual harassment, and actions taken to address the problem and support survivors who come forward.

Mr. Kleinsteuber, Hon. Member for Calgary-Northern Hills, made a statement regarding On-It Regional Transit, a public transit initiative of the Calgary Regional Partnership that services the Calgary metropolitan area.

Mr. Sucha, Hon. Member for Calgary-Shaw, made a statement regarding two upcoming football playoff games, one to be held on November 18, 2017, between the University of Calgary Dinos and the Université Laval Rouge et Or, the winner advancing to the Vanier Cup, and the other between the Edmonton Eskimos and the Calgary Stampeders to advance to the 105th Grey Cup, and regarding concerns raised by indigenous communities about the Edmonton Eskimos' team name.

MLA Drever, Hon. Member for Calgary-Bow, made a statement regarding Government efforts to make the election system more transparent, and commenting on contributions made in support of Jason Kenney, Leader of the United Conservative Party.

## **Presenting Petitions**
