A debate followed on the amendment.

Dr. Swann, Hon. Member for Calgary-Mountain View, made a statement regarding a lack of measurement and targets to improve mental health care access, quality, and cost-effectiveness, and the need for new leadership in this area.

Dr. Starke, Hon. Member for Vermilion-Lloydminster, made a statement regarding the quality of political discourse and statements from the Official Opposition and the Government regarding the economy.

#### **Presenting Petitions**

Dr. Swann, Hon. Member for Calgary-Mountain View, presented a petition from hundreds of Albertans urging the Government to reverse the decision by Alberta Health Services to stop offering non-insured fertility services (such as Intrauterine Insemination (IUI), In Vitro Fertilization (IVF), donor eggs and sperm programs) at the Alberta Health Services Regional Fertility and Women's Endocrine Clinic at Edmonton's Lois Hole Hospital for Women.

Mr. Shepherd, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Centre, present a petition from 134 Albertans urging the Government to introduce legislation to end discrimination against children and their caregivers in condominium and rental housing.
