The Speaker took the Chair at 1:30 p.m.

The Speaker offered a prayer, and a moment of silence was observed in recognition of the death of former Member Dr. Albert Hohol, Member for Edmonton-Belmont, 1971 to 1979, who passed away on November 17, 2017.
