Members' Statements

Mr. Cyr, Hon. Member for Bonnyville-Cold Lake, made a statement regarding federal government energy policies that are more burdensome to domestically produced Canadian oil than to foreign oil imported into Canada.

Ms Sweet, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Manning, made a statement recognizing March 4 to 10, 2018, as Social Work Week, with this year's theme being Bringing Change to Life.

Mr. Schneider, Hon. Member for Little Bow, made a statement regarding the Government's limited response to rural crime levels despite the Official Opposition's attempt to bring the issue to the Government's attention and a concern that the Government's funding announcement to address this issue will take too long to implement.

Ms Kazim, Hon. Member for Calgary-Glenmore, made a statement regarding community engagement by Calgary-Glenmore constituents that led to a Ministerial Order directing Alberta Transportation and KGL Constructors to further protect wetlands disturbed by construction of the Southwest Calgary Ring Road.

Mrs. Pitt, Hon. Member for Airdrie, made a statement regarding Government policies on busing school children, consultations held by Rocky View Schools on this issue, and suggesting the Government study the impact their policies have on families and communities.

Mr. Carson, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Meadowlark, made a statement regarding an opportunity for Alberta to lead in research and development of artificial intelligence and innovation with the assistance of the Alberta Investor Tax Credit and the Capital Investment Tax Credit.

Presenting Petitions

Dr. Swann, Hon. Member for Calgary-Mountain View, presented a petition from 22 Albertans urging the Government to reassess, update, and complete written protocols for all species on which restrictions on rehabilitation or fostering are placed under the standard terms and conditions (Schedule "A") to wildlife rehabilitation permits, so that orphaned and injured animals may be assisted, and allow for the rehabilitation and release back into the wild.
