### **Members' Statements**

Ms Luff, Hon. Member for Calgary-East, made a statement recognizing Nadia El Dibs, a 22-year-old woman who on March 25, 2018, was murdered by a man she knew, and regarding her family's hope that her death will bring awareness to the issue of violence against women.

Mr. Panda, Hon. Member for Calgary-Foothills, made a statement regarding the constitutional and economic crisis concerning the Trans Mountain Pipeline expansion and suggestions identified by the Official Opposition in order to clear political hurdles to getting the pipeline built.

Dr. Turner, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Whitemud, made a statement regarding Logan Boulet, a member of the Humboldt Broncos hockey team killed in a collision on April 6, 2018, who, by registering as an organ and tissue donor, prompted a massive increase in Albertans registering as donors, and regarding Revée Agyepong, the first adult in Canada to be cured of sickle cell anemia by stem cell donation.

Mr. Schneider, Hon. Member for Little Bow, made a statement regarding how some opposition policies have been taken up by the Government and have engaged media and political commentary.

Mr. Malkinson, Hon. Member for Calgary-Currie, made a statement regarding support from Albertans and the Government for Henson Trust legislation in Alberta.

Mr. Orr, Hon. Member for Lacombe-Ponoka, made a statement regarding the Lacombe Generals and the Stoney Creek Generals AAA men's hockey teams who participated in the Allan Cup hockey championship held in Rosetown, Saskatchewan, from April 9 to 14, 2018.

(2) Suborder (1) does not prevent a Legislative Policy Committee from undertaking a hearing or inquiry during the same period of time that a matter stands referred to the Committee by the Assembly if the hearing or inquiry does not interfere with the work of the Committee on the matter referred to it.
