### **Members' Statements**

Mr. Dach, Hon. Member for Edmonton-McClung, made a statement regarding how Bill 26, An Act to Combat Poverty and Fight for Albertans with Disabilities, will support vulnerable Albertans.

Mr. Barnes, Hon. Member for Cypress-Medicine Hat, made a statement regarding the hardships and burdens resulting from Government economic policy.

Mrs. Littlewood, Hon. Member for Fort Saskatchewan-Vegreville, made a statement recognizing the Ukrainian famine and genocide, known as the Holodomor, and reflecting on her trip last year to Kiev, Ukraine, along with Hon. Mr. Bilous, Minister of Economic Development and Trade.
