Debate continued on the amendment introduced by Mr. Bilous, Official Opposition House Leader, on behalf of Ms Sigurdson, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Riverview, on June 11, 2019, that the motion be amended by deleting all of the words after "that" and substituting the following:

Bill 8, Education Amendment Act, 2019, be not now read a Second time because the Assembly is of the view that further time is necessary to enable school boards to adjust their policies to comply with the proposed legislation and regulations.

Mr. Dang moved adjournment of the debate on the amendment, which was agreed to.
