  - (a) acknowledge the recent increase in COVID-19 cases in Alberta,
  - (b) express its support for the Government in any future actions that will help protect the public, and
  - (c) urge the Government to
    - (i) continue to provide the necessary supports to small- and medium-sized businesses to assist in their economic recovery, and
    - (ii) encourage Albertans to follow all future actions taken by the Government in order to help relieve the pressure on our health care system.

Ms Sweet, Official Opposition House Leader, on behalf of Ms Notley, Hon. Leader of the Official Opposition, gave oral notice of her intention to move, pursuant to Standing Order 30, to adjourn the ordinary business of the Assembly to discuss a matter of urgent public importance, namely, the alarming and rapid increase in cases in Alberta over the weekend; the federal release on Friday of modelling that indicates an expectation that COVID-19 spread in Alberta will continue to rapidly grow exponentially based on current trajectories; the dangerous levels of pressure being experienced in our healthcare sector due to the recent increases; and the recently growing need for economic supports for small- and medium-sized businesses in the province to survive the pandemic.
