Ms Sweet, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Manning, made a statement regarding Government policies and the need to address challenges facing the agriculture sector.

Mr. Yao, Hon. Member for Fort McMurray-Wood Buffalo, made a statement regarding the need for the Government to make strategic investments in the constituency of Fort McMurray-Wood Buffalo.

Ms Pancholi, Hon. Member for Edmonton-Whitemud, made a statement regarding the need to address the increase in deaths of children and youth in the child intervention system.

Mr. Turton, Hon. Member for Spruce Grove-Stony Plain, made a statement regarding Alberta's sister province Hokkaido, Japan.

- (b) call on the Government of Canada to revoke
 - (i) its proof of vaccination requirement for airline passengers, and

(ii) its pre-departure COVID-19 testing requirement for international airline passengers entering Canada.
