# **Speaker's Statement – Tabling Returns and Reports**

Honourable Members, prior to moving to the introduction of guests today, I do have a brief statement that I would like to make with respect to the Daily Routine.

In an April 22, 1993, ruling on the matter of tabling sensitive documents, Speaker Schumacher expressed extreme concern about the tabling of documents of a private or confidential matter. In his ruling on May 8, 2007, Speaker Kowalski reminded the Assembly that Alberta is one of the few jurisdictions in which voluntary tablings, those documents other than documents required to be tabled by statute or the Standing Orders, are allowed to be tabled, and Speaker Kowalski cautioned that the Assembly be very careful with the privilege in here we have with respect to tablings.

It is indeed the Member who is tabling the document who bears responsibility for the document itself. Even though Members have absolute privilege in this Assembly, that does not mean that that document produced by the Assembly could not become the content of a legal proceeding. As such, I encourage Members to weigh very carefully the oaths that they may have otherwise made when it comes to tabling such confidential documents.

Honourable Members, further to that, I will remain steadfast that it is up to the Assembly as to whether or not they wish to continue to permit voluntary tablings.
